CERID visited Gole-Kumungu Women VSLA group to introduce and promote the energy saving improved in which two medium sized charcoal stove were taken to be paid in instalment on credit.

2.0 Objective of the activity:-

- To increase awareness on renewable energy technologies in Alionji women VSLAs group in Koboko District particularly Lobule sub counties.
- To increase adoption to Renewable Energy products like Improved Cook stoves among women group.
- To sale out the Renewable Energy products to the communities
- To reduce on the excessive use of trees for firewood
- To minimize health risks arising from the smoke out of firewood used by the three stone fire users.

7.0. CHALLEGES AND RECOMMENDATIONS / WAY FOWARD:-

- > Crashing of stoves due to potholes all along the road.
- Under attendance as the targeted number of people weren't reached due too much rainfalls.
- Products don't suit some beneficiaries' interests as most are interested in the small size that are out of stock.
